SUBMISSION GUIDELINES:

ABSTRACTS: Submit an abstract of 300-500 words outlining the objectives, methodology, key findings, and relevance to the conference theme.
FULL PAPERS: Submit full papers, which should not exceed 7,000 words, including references.
FORMATTING: Papers should follow APA (7th Edition) formatting guidelines.

SUBMISSION Abstracts must be submitted by 15th February 2025.

- **NOTIFICATION OF** Authors will be notified of abstract acceptance by 1st March 2025.
- FULL PAPERFull papers are due by 30th April 2025.DEADLINE:
